Dearest Brothers and Sisters,

All too often, we can observe a phenomenon of band wagoning and one-upmanship in the media, which robs words of their true meaning. Brother Georges LASSOUS, past Sovereign Grand Commander, for his action at the head of our Jurisdiction over which he presided with great wisdom for the last three years, during and after the pandemic, thus ensuring its stability and renewal.

After those hand-overs concerning all Lodges, and the upcoming summer season, we must not lay down our tools, but remain, instead well aware of our duties towards our members, permanently on the watch for perceiving ever more completely a world which we always hope to be better and more enlightened.
